He received a B.A. from Lebanon Valley College of Pennsylvania and the Master of Music degree from Yale University's Institute of Sacred Music. He is noted as a composer and an improviser. He has been featured as organist with the Lancaster (OH) Festival Orchestra, and has performed on *Pipedreams Live!*, *Pipedreams* on NPR, and on WOSU-FM in Columbus. He was a featured recitalist in the Piccolo Spoleto music festival in Charleston, South Carolina, and has also concertized in Connecticut, Michigan, New York, Pennsylvania, and West Virginia. If you love the music of the organ, you'll love this talented performer's presentation.
